

INTRODUCTION







Essence of Being marks the inaugural exhibition of CSB Fine Arts and introduces audiences to the commanding abstractions of Samuel E. Vázquez.

Born in Puerto Rico and raised in New York, Vázquez's practice emerges from the graffiti and hip-hop movements that defined the city's cultural fabric in the 1980s. Over the years, he has forged a visual language where rhythm, gesture, and memory converge into radiant fields of color and form. His canvases pulse with the life of the metropolis while offering meditations on identity, resilience, and the act of creation itself.

This exhibition not only traces the arc of an artist who transforms lived experience into abstraction but also opens a new chapter for CSB Fine Arts, whose mission is to amplify Puerto Rican and Latin American voices within contemporary art.



ESSENCE OF BEING:

The Abstractions of Samuel E. Vázquez

Essence of Being inaugurates CSB Fine Arts with the work of Samuel E. Vázquez, an artist whose career embodies the crossings and tensions of Puerto Rican and New York cultures. Born in Puerto Rico and raised in Harlem/Spanish Harlem, Vázquez came of age during the 1980s, when graffiti and hip-hop emerged as vital forms of expression in communities too often excluded from the cultural mainstream. These movements provided him not only with a language of rhythm and gesture but also with a philosophy of transformation: of claiming visibility, of making beauty out of what the world overlooked or discarded.

This sensibility extends into his studio practice. Alongside his vibrant abstractions, Vázquez creates assemblages that reimagine what others deem refuse—wood, metal, paper, fragments of the everyday—repurposed into works that pulse with dignity and vitality. In this act of reconfiguration, he aligns with a broader lineage in Latin American art, where artists from Puerto Rico to Brazil to Mexico have long redefined the very boundaries of material, imbuing the remnants of modern life with new meaning.

His canvases, meanwhile, vibrate with movement: bold strokes, layered textures, and shifting fields of color that echo both the density of the city and the improvisational freedom of music. The syncopated rhythms of jazz and the pulse of hip-hop infuse his work, turning painting into a visual equivalent of sound—at once spontaneous and intensely structured. Yet beyond rhythm and form, his abstractions are meditations on identity, resilience, and the persistence of memory. They invite us into the space between chaos and order, where histories—personal and collective, Puerto Rican and diasporic—find expression in color and form.







Essence of Being is thus both a milestone in Vázquez's career and a statement of purpose for CSB Fine Arts. It celebrates an artist who has transmuted the urgency of the street and the remnants of the everyday into a refined painterly idiom, and it affirms the gallery's mission to amplify Puerto Rican and Latin American voices in the global field of contemporary art.



BIOGRAPHY

Samuel E Vázquez (b. 1970, San Juan, Puerto Rico) is a contemporary visual artist. He has exhibited along-side Helen Frankenthaler, Joan Mitchell, Sam Gilliam, Sabina Klein, Sam Francis, Keith Haring, Torrick "Toxic" Ablack, and Futura 2000 among others.

Vázquez was a feature artist in special programming for Ai Weiwei: According to What? exhibition. His work is rooted in the New York City subway painting era of the 1970s and 80s and informed by the work of Ed Clark, Mimmo Rotella, Jacques Villeglé, Jackson Pollock, and Jean-Michel Basquiat.

ARTIST STATEMENT

My studio practice investigates humanity's resilience to rise above social constructs. Through the use of diverse materials these investigations reveal the inner strength, often found in underserved communities, to thrive amid chaos. Via a rigorous process of applying layers of found materials and markings, my work evokes the effects of the systematic neglect that is thrust upon our supposedly insignificant inner city communities. In painting, I pursue abstract methods of home.
